A Note from the Pastor's Desk



"Enter God's gates with thanksgiving and God's courts with praise; give thanks to God, and praise God's name." Psalm 100:4

Without a doubt, Thanksgiving is my favorite holiday! It always has been. Growing up, I think it was my favorite holiday because it always meant good food and time with cousins, aunts, uncles, grandparents, and of course my nuclear family. We always had great food, great conversations, and lots of love. I continued that tradition with my own children and every year family would gather for a long weekend of celebrating, my house overflowing with my parents, brothers, sisters, and their children. It was a time of great joy. Wonderful memories were made. But the food, the family, the laughter, and the fun, while predictable, were only a part of the celebration. Every year, as a delicious meal was prepared and served, we spent the beginning of each meal sharing our blessings, offering what we were grateful for. Sometimes it was predictable – gratitude for food, family, and a warm house. Other times it was more complex – gratitude for the life of a loved one who had passed; gratitude for healing from a serious accident or illness; gratitude for a new or unexpected opportunity; gratitude to have made it through another year. Gratitude is an attitude ingrained in me from a young age and one I have attempted to ingrain into my children. Even when things are tough, what do I have to be thankful for. When I had pneumonia right before Holy Week, I was thankful it was the week before so I could lead all of the Holy Week Services. When I had a stroke in June, I was grateful that the stroke impacted my mobility and not my ability to think or speak. When a foot crack sent me to the emergency room unable to walk, I was thankful it was a tear and a sprain and not a break requiring surgery. It has been a difficult year in many ways, but I have tried to approach the year with an attitude of gratitude. I have focused on what has been good about the year. The opportunity to serve a vital and interesting congregation. The opportunity to extend and receive care and compassion. The opportunity to wake up each day and see what God has in store. I have so many blessings, it's hard to count them all. I pray you may be as blessed!

A Message from the Moderators

Dear Members and Friends,

Thank you to all who attended the Vision Board meeting on October 2, 2023 and participated in the presentation by Rev. Margret Hofmeister. Rev. Hofmeister has been the Area Conference Minister for the Southwest Region of the Southern New England UCC since March 2023. As she will be advising the congregation in our search for a settled pastor, she joined us on October 2 to provide an overview of the search process. We thought it important to use this space this month to update the congregation with the information that she shared. Our goal is for everyone to have a consistent and clear understanding of the status of the settled pastor search process.

The first step in the search process is the formation of the Search and Call Committee. However, we have a bit of work to do before that Committee can be formed. Rev. Hofmeister noted that our church bylaws do <u>not</u> outline how a Search Committee is to be formed. Given this, the Vision Board will need to determine how the Search Committee will be selected. Your church leadership is actively reviewing how past search committees were formed and anticipate using a similar process that we will update where necessary. In the upcoming weeks, the Vision Board will be voting on this process, and we will be informing the congregation as soon as possible about what the search committee formation procedures will look like.

Rev. Hofmeister advised that the Search Committee should consist of 7 - a maximum of 9 church members with the following characteristics:

- A deep commitment to the well-being of the church and willingness to work on behalf of the whole congregation.
- An ability to set aside personal desires and put the focus on the future of the church and our congregation, guided by a clear understanding of the church's Vision and Mission Statement.
- Collectively reflect a diverse representation of the congregation: different ages, backgrounds, lengths of membership, gender, life stages, and cross-section of theological beliefs.
- A willingness to devote significant time to the process.
- Skills that include organization, openness, communication and listening.
- A willingness to compromise and understand the importance of the need for consensus.
- A commitment to keep all Search Committee information confidential, understanding that sharing information with church members, one's family or one's friends will jeopardize the integrity of the process.
- An openness to consider any candidate God may send to us without preconceptions of who that should be.

Ultimately, the Vision Board (composed of the co-moderators, treasurer, church clerk and a representative of each Ministry) will be selecting the Search Committee.

After the Search Committee has been formed, its tasks include:

• Creating a written church profile that describes who we are, who are neighbors are, who God is calling us to be, the challenges we have faced, and how we deal with conflict. The content of this profile is guided

by our Vision and Mission statement and additional feedback from the congregation. Once the profile is approved by the Search Committee and Vision Board, it will be submitted to Rev. Hofmeister for her review and suggestions. After discussion/changes, it will be posted on the National Website under the SNEUCC, and ministerial candidates will be able to view our profile. Interested candidates contact Jill Ford, an SNEUCC staff member dedicated to search and call, and ask her to send our Search Committee their profile.

- Reviewing the profiles of interested candidates and conducting interviews.
- Discerning toward a final candidate.
- Introducing a final candidate to the Congregation.

Rev. Hofmeister alerted us to the current conference-wide "climate" with regard to search and call of which our congregation needs to be aware:

- There are currently more churches looking for clergy than there are clergy looking for churches.
- Most clergy candidates are female, minority, or LGBTQ.
- Current clergy candidates highly value boundaries, work-life balance, and time for self-care.
- Clergy candidates are looking for
 - o fair and equitable compensation,
 - o congregations that are transparent about past challenges and open to working through them, and
 - o healthy environments where people work well together and are engaged in ministry.
- It is commonly taking churches 12-18 months to complete the Search and Call process.

We realize that this is a lot of information to digest. However, we present it openly and transparently so that everyone understands the process and can develop reasonable expectations going forward. If there are any questions about any of the information that we have presented, please address those questions directly to us, members of the Vision Board, and Rev. Meredith. For additional general information, please visit www.sneucc.org, choose the Change Agents tab, and then select "The Search and Call Journey" which provides information and videos regarding each phase of the Search and Call process.

This is an exciting time in our church life. We ask for your prayers and God's guidance as we march into our future.






BOOK CLUB NEWS






November will present two opportunities to learn more about the Bible.


