October 15 – Children's Sabbath



However, for the October 2nd meeting, we especially invite anyone who might want to learn more about the Search process and/or who might be prayerfully considering serving as a member of the Search Committee to attend the 7 pm meeting and learn more about the process. For anyone with questions, this is an opportunity to learn more and to help you determine if God is calling you to this type of service for the future of our church. So please, join us, staff and the entire Vision Board at 7 pm on October 2nd. Rev. Hofmeister's information session will be at the beginning of the meeting, and visitors can choose to leave after she has provided her overview of the Search Process.

The second special Team that will be forming soon is our 350th Anniversary Celebration Team. Our church's momentous 350th Anniversary is coming up in 2025, but the year of celebration will kick off in May 2024. We need to begin planning soon! The possibilities for varied and exciting celebrations throughout the 2024-2025 year are endless. We need creativity, energy, and positivity to identify the most celebratory ways to honor this momentous year. Are you a party organizer? Do you have creative ideas about how we can honor our 350 years of doing God's work? Are you good at getting people motivated, excited, and involved? Do you know how to get the community to participate in our excitement and celebration? We need you! Please contact us, Pastor Meredith, or the church office to volunteer your time and talent.

The newly recreated Children's Choir will participate in this service singing "Mungo ni Mwema" (God is so Good). A group of women will sing the poignant "Prayer of the Children" by Kurt Bestor which focusses on the experiences that our **children** are going through.

Music Group Rehearsals have been launched for the most part. BUT, there is always room for more. Your participation in singing in the services is tremendously appreciated. "Making a joyful noise" is what counts whether you find the designated notes on the page or not. Hymns are chosen for their message and complement or summarize or support what the general theme of the service is. So even if you don't sing out loud, read the words of the song. Think of it as a poem which is really what it is. I am trying to print the words of the songs we sing so you can follow along when the choir sings.

Introducing Your Vision Board and Ministry Coordinators

At the Annual Congregational Meeting on June 11, 2023, this Congregation approved a pilot implementation of a Ministry Team organizational structure at First Congregational Church. Over the next year, the organizational structure will consist of a Vision Board (in lieu of Church Council), and six Ministries that include: Worship, Faith Formation, Membership, Congregational Care, Mission and Outreach, and Administration. Each Ministry will include five elected coordinators, volunteer team leaders, and team members who will carry out the programs and ministries of the church according to our established core values, Vision and Mission. The Vision Board, which will serve to establish and clarify our Vision, Mission, and strategic issues, is comprised of the elected church officers (Co-Moderators, Treasurer and Clerk) and a coordinator from each of the six Ministries. Pastor Meredith Jeffers will serve as an ex-officio member of the Vision Board.

The following creative and dedicated Officers and Ministry Coordinators have been at work through July and August 2023 getting our new model and its functions off the ground.

• <u>Interim Senior Minister:</u> The minister will be serving as guide, worship leader, and advisor to all Ministry Teams as we implement the Vision Board, Ministry Teams, and strategic plans.

We would like to share some ideas on how to best communicate with both this committee and Pastor Meredith.

- 1. **Direct Communication is Key!** We encourage anyone who has feedback in regards to church life to communicate directly with Pastor Meredith or church staff. If you do not feel comfortable doing so, please contact a member of the IPRC committee as we would be glad to sit down together to solve problems. We believe direct communication is key, this way we are able to meet with you to answer your questions.
- 2. **Communicate Often!** If you have ideas or needs that should be addressed, please try to bring them up promptly so they can be addressed in a timely manner this will help from compounding issues over time.
- 3. **Be Respectful and Empathetic:** when communicating with others, please be mindful of how you are posing your ideas. If this feedback were coming to you, how would you receive it? Often difficult conversations should be relayed in person, as it is sometimes challenging to ascertain the meaning behind a text or an email.
- 4. **Provide Potential Solutions:** be open to helping to find a solution. You do not have to be the person executing the solution, though try to come to the table with some ideas. Often the best ideas and results come from a friendly collaborative space.

Currently, the IPRC committee consists of the following members: John Perkowski, Kathy Filkins, Heidi Bonassar, Jessie DePonte and Greg Whitehouse. We encourage you to reach out to us should you need help communicating any concerns that you have.

We understand that clear, direct and respectful communication is the cornerstone of our church. Without these principles, the climate of the church attitude can change quickly. As we move through this time of transition, we ask that we all work together to provide solutions for any challenges that may arise.




The church school kicked off on Catch the Spirit Sunday with very excited students ready to come back for another school year! We are grateful to all of our volunteer teachers!





We Would Like to Be There When You Need Us!


