A Note from the Pastor's Desk

Beloved! Let Us Love One Another!

Many years ago, I directed children's choirs. One of the favorite songs of all the choirs was Let Us Love One Another! I John 4:7-8. Bum bum bum bum! It was a great spirited song. I loved that the kids learned right from the beginning that God is love and we are called to love one another. Some Sunday, maybe I'll teach it to you, but until then, I would like to talk about how that passage, I John 4:7-8, has been shaping the current and future ministry of the First Congregational Church of Wallingford.

For many years, this church has had a commitment to ministry at Ashlar Village. Services have been held, Bible Studies offered, flowers delivered, relationships built, all in the name of sharing the love of God. But like many things, Covid took its toll and our ministry to Ashlar had to be scaled back. Visits were curtailed, services reduced to twice a month, and Bible Studies were no more. But the people of First Church love the people of Ashlar and the people of Ashlar love First Church. Since at least December, residents of Ashlar have been asking for more - more Services, more Bible Study, more Visits, more Love. After careful listening and prayerful consideration, First Church will be responding to what we have heard by returning to four services a month starting in September. Bible Study will be starting at Ashlar on Wednesday mornings in October. We will be matching Ashlar residents with church people for one-on-one relationships and care. Beloved! Let us love one another!

Our ministry at Ashlar has inspired us to revitalize our ministry of care to mostly Senior members and friends living in the community as well. Community members will be connected to church members promoting one-on-one relationships and care. The goal is to extend the love of God and this community to those who have been an active part of this community in the past, but who, for various reasons, are unable to be with us in person. All told, more than 90 people, at Ashlar and in the community are on our list. Beloved, let us love one another!

Are we there yet? Are we there yet? Are we there yet? How many of us can remember being on long car trips and calling out this question from the back seat because we were so eager to get to our destination? Excitement about vacation, the amusement park, family visits, or a favorite sporting event made it hard to wait patiently to travel the miles ahead of us. A wish to get there faster made us fidgety, restless, and maybe even a little frustrated.

After several years of change, pandemic, and transitions, many of us may be having the same feelings about the journey on which this congregation currently finds itself. We are in the midst of our interim ministry, when we try to shift from the leadership of one settled minister and prepare for the leadership of a new settled minister. After all of the change that we have been through, many of us are craving the stability and sense of security that we anticipate a settled minister will bring. And, being only human, we may be wishing that the process of getting that settled minister was moving faster.

However, before we can initiate that search for potential ministerial candidates, we as a congregation must be in a state of readiness that we can clearly communicate to those potential candidates. There are many factors that determine our level of readiness, but we would like to highlight two of them. We must have a clear sense of the church's organizational structure and be able to demonstrate that it is functioning well so that a candidate can imagine entering the ministry with clarity about our congregation's vision, mission, and purpose. We also must be able to demonstrate financial stability and an ongoing ability to fund our programs, initiatives, and building needs for the years to come. Essentially, we must be able to show that *we* are a stable place for a potential new settled minister to land.

With two of the "criteria" for our state of readiness in mind, it should be clear that we are not quite there yet. But, we are making progress on our journey. We are rolling out our Ministry Teams organizational model, and the energy and enthusiasm that we have seen in the early stages of this adventure have been exciting. Our Vision Board and Ministry Teams are gelling. We are in a period of monitoring, evaluating and adjusting the work of the Ministries to ensure that valued programs and missions are not left behind. Beyond that, we are trying to design a structure that nurtures creativity and allows us to expand our Ministries in ways we have not yet considered. We have also moved into our new fiscal year with a clear understanding from our Financial Team (previously known as the Trustees) that we face significant challenges if we do not find ways to increase the income needed to fund our church.

We have been called upon to increase our personal giving and find new and creative ways to raise the funds necessary to maintain our identity as the church at the corner of Center and Main that does so much for its community and offers a welcoming spiritual home to all. With the guidance of Pastor Meredith and her experience in helping congregations move through interim periods such as ours, we are steadily monitoring our readiness to put together a search committee and begin the process of finding and calling our next settled minister. We will also be tapping into the resources that the Southern New England UCC conference can provide in our journey.

To reach the state of readiness to search for candidates and eventually call a new settled minister into our church family, we need your help. In ways large and small, each one of us needs to be engaged in the Ministries and teamwork of our church. There is an open invitation to all to communicate with the Vision Board and Ministry Coordinators about your interests, energies and passions so that we can find a place for you. Similarly, each one of us needs to continue to reflect on what we can do to strengthen the finances of the church so that God's work in this place can be done. Offering your time, talents, and treasure is critical to our state of readiness.

So, are we there yet? No, not yet. But, we are moving steadily in the direction of our goal. Guided by the Holy Spirit, let us travel the road together with optimism, hope, and anticipation!

Introducing Your Vision Board and Ministry Coordinators

At the Annual Congregational Meeting on June 11, 2023, this Congregation approved a pilot implementation of a Ministry Team organizational structure at First Congregational Church. Over the next year, the organizational structure will consist of a Vision Board (in lieu of Church Council), and six Ministries that include: Worship, Faith Formation, Membership, Congregational Care, Mission and Outreach, and Administration. Each Ministry will include five elected coordinators, volunteer team leaders, and team members who will carry out the programs and ministries of the church according to our established core values, Vision and Mission. The Vision Board, which will serve to establish and clarify our Vision, Mission, and strategic issues, is comprised of the elected church officers (Co-Moderators, Treasurer and Clerk) and a coordinator from each of the six Ministries. Pastor Meredith Jeffers will serve as an ex-officio member of the Vision Board.

The following creative and dedicated Officers and Ministry Coordinators have been at work through July and August 2023 getting our new model and its functions off the ground.

• <u>Interim Senior Minister:</u> The minister will be serving as guide, worship leader, and advisor to all Ministry Teams as we implement the Vision Board, Ministry Teams, and strategic plans.

Often difficult conversations should be relayed in person, as it is sometimes challenging to ascertain the meaning behind a text or an email.
- 4. **Provide Potential Solutions:** be open to helping to find a solution. You do not have to be the person executing the solution, though try to come to the table with some ideas. Often the best ideas and results come from a friendly collaborative space.

Currently, the IPRC committee consists of the following members: John Perkowski, Kathy Filkins, Heidi Bonassar, Jessie DePonte and Greg Whitehouse. We encourage you to reach out to us should you need help communicating any concerns that you have.

We understand that clear, direct and respectful communication is the cornerstone of our church. Without these principles, the climate of the church attitude can change quickly. As we move through this time of transition, we ask that we all work together to provide solutions for any challenges that may arise.
